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

### **EXPLANATION**

The Relay Output Module can be used in applications where the analog/digital output from the drive is converted to a relay output. Typical applications are where two relay outputs are required. The functions of the relays are programmable in the drive and can be any of the following:

- Drive enabled
- **Drive healthy**
- Drive at set speed
- Drive at zero speed
- Drive at max speed 0
- Motor in overload

# Programming the first relay output

Since the first relay output (fitted within the ACS250/ACS255 (115V-480V Variant) is programmed using parameter 1401 in the drive, two completely independent relay outputs are available. The following options are supported for relay 1:

1401	Relay 1 output function select (RO1)
0 : Drive enabled	Defines the function of the user relay 1,
1 : Drive healthy 2 : Motor at target speed	when the operating conditions are met.  Disabled: Contacts open
3 : Drive tripped 4 : Motor speed >= limit 5 : Motor current >= limit	Enabled : Contacts closed
6: Motor current >= Ilmit 6: Motor speed < limit 7: Motor current < limit	Options 4 to 7: the Relay output is enabled using the level set in parameter <b>3200</b>

Programming the second relay output
The second relay output is controlled using parameter 1501. This can be set to any of the choices 0-7 as described below:

1501	Relay 2 output function select (RO2)
0 : Drive enabled 1 : Drive healthy	Defines the function of the user relay 2, when the operating conditions are met.
2 : Motor at target speed 3 : Drive tripped 4 : Motor speed >= limit	Disabled : Contacts open Enabled : Contacts closed
5 : Motor current >= limit 6 : Motor speed < limit 7 : Motor current < limit	Options 4 to 7 : the Digital output is enabled using the level set in Parameter 3200.

Note: Parameters 1401,1501, and 3200 are located in the Long parameter group, group navigation is detailed in the drive manual.
